Code of Conduct for Kingfishers Swimming Club: Parents/Guardians

1. I will complete and return the Medical Information Form as requested by the club and provide details of any health conditions/concerns relevant my child on the Medical Form. I will report any changes in the state of my child's health to the coach prior to training sessions or events. I will ensure that the organisation has up-to-date contact details for me and for any alternative person(s) as required.
2. I will deliver and collect my child punctually at the start and end of training sessions/events. I will inform a club official or coaching staff if there is an unavoidable problem which will cause a delay in attendance or collection. If the club changes my child's lane and/or changes training session times, I will remember that the change is to provide appropriate levels of training and to enable my child to progress, and I should therefore support and encourage this at all times.
3. I will ensure my child is properly and adequately attired for the training session or event including all mandatory equipment, e.g. hats, goggles, etc.
4. I will inform the coach/welfare officer before a session if my child is to be collected early from a training session/event and if so, by whom.
5. I will encourage my child to obey the rules and teach them that they can only do their best.
6. I will show appreciation and support my child and all team members.
7. I will support the coach, club officials and club committee appropriately and raise any concerns I have in an appropriate manner through the club welfare officer.
8. I will not enter poolside unless in an emergency or requested to do so.
9. If I wish to have a discussion with the coach I will check with the welfare officer or club official/front of house reception team to arrange this.
10. Most of all I will encourage and support my child to do the best they can and to enjoy their sport.

Kingfishers Will

1. Inform you at once if your child becomes ill and will ensure their wellbeing until you are able to collect him/her.



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2. Ensure good child safeguarding guidelines are followed at all times to keep your child safe.
3. Ensure all activities are properly supervised/taught/coached and that consent is and obtained for any activity outside that previously agreed.

You Have a Right To

1. Make a complaint to the club or Swim England if you feel the club or a member of the club or Swim England is not acting appropriately or in accordance with Swim England/club rules and regulations. Details of how this can be done can be obtained from the club welfare officer.
2. Make a complaint on behalf of your child to the Swim England Office of Judicial Administration.
